Operation of Plant (2700): Activities concerned with keeping the physical plant open, comfortable and safe for use and keeping buildings and equipment in an efficient working condition. e.g., Maintenance & custodial areas. Transportation (2800): Activities concerned with the conveyance of students to and from school and to activities. Statistical Services (2900): Activities, other than general administration, which support each of the other instructional and supporting services programs. e.g., Personnel and technology.

Community Services (3200): Payments made by the District to support activities that do not directly relate to providing education for pupils in the District.

Extracurricular Activities (4000): Subject matter and/or activities not provided in regular classes. Generally, participation is not required and credit is not given.

Capital Outlay (5000): Improvements to the District buildings & land. Contingencies (7000): To be used for unanticipated emergencies.

SB 210 Nutrition Compliance Report

Winton Woods City Schools Board of Education Policies 8500 & 8550 April 2012

As mandated by SB 210, beginning July 2011 all schools must meet certain nutrition standards on all "a la carte" foods sold during the school day. This impacts the Child Nutrition Department as well as all vending and any school stores.

We are pleased to report that the Child Nutrition Department took steps to meet these guidelines by drastically reducing the amount and type of snacks and beverages we sell to students. The students were not pleased with these changes at first but seem to have adjusted well. This year, students are now purchasing more meals and fewer snacks. This is good for them and also good for our program.

In the Primary Schools we only sell 100% juice drinks and water "a la carte".

The Elementary and Intermediate Schools only sell 100% juice drinks and water, and a few snacks that meet the Alliance for a Healthier Generation Guidelines.

The Middle and High School only sell beverages that meet the SB 210 guidelines and only snacks that meet the Alliance for a Healthier Generation.

In an effort to please students and still offer another serving line at the High School, we have incorporated meals into our snack bar. Along with the limited snacks available, students can purchase chef salads, nachos & cheese, chicken sandwiches and pizza meals in that line.

School principals are responsible for overseeing vending machines and school stores in their respective buildings. Our principals are pleased to report that their schools are also in compliance.

Additional Budget Cuts for 2012-13

In addition to the \$1.4 million of FY 2013 budget reductions already approved by the Board of Education on March 23, 2012, I am recommending the following additions:

High School Busing	\$112,000
2.5 High School Teachers	\$125,000
Energy Consultant Cost Savings (Midwest Utilities)	\$ 35,000
Electrical Cost Savings (Duke Energy Retail)	\$ 25,000

OAPSE has filed a grievance against the Board's decision to outsource. The administration will continue to bargain in good faith until the issue can be resolved. In the meantime, I am recommending the following budget cuts based on actual salaries and benefits of the impacted individuals:

3 Custodians,

1 Instructional Assistant vacant position, and

Supplemental summer cleaning
